- C. finding the number of employees who earn a commission that is higher than the average commission of the company
- D. listing the departments whose average commission is more that 600
- E. listing the employees who do not earn commission and who are working for department 20 in descending order of the employee ID
- F. listing the employees whose annual commission is more than 6000

Correct Answer: AC

QUESTION 2

On your Oracle 12c database, you invoked SQL *Loader to load data into the EMPLOYEES table in the HR schema by issuing the following command:

\$> sqlldr hr/hr@pdb table=employees

Which two statements are true regarding the command?

- A. It succeeds with default settings if the EMPLOYEES table belonging to HR is already defined in the database.
- B. It fails because no SQL *Loader data file location is specified.
- C. It fails if the HR user does not have the CREATE ANY DIRECTORY privilege.
- D. It fails because no SQL *Loader control file location is specified.

Correct Answer: AC

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*SQL*Loader is invoked when you specify the sqlldr command and, optionally, parameters that establish session characteristics.

Which SQL statement displays the date March 19, 2001 in a format that appears as "Nineteenth of March 2001 12:00:00 AM"?

A. SELECTTO_CHAR(TO_DATE(\\'19-Mar-2001\\', `DD-Mon-YYYY\\'), `fmDdspth"of" Month YYYY fmHH:MI:SS AM\\') NEW_DATE. FROM dual;

B. SELECTTO_CHAR(TO_DATE(\\'19-Mar-2001\\', `DD-Mon-YYYY\\'), `Ddspth"of" Month YYYY fmHH:MI:SS AM\\') NEW_DATEFROM dual;

C. SELECTTO_CHAR(TO_DATE(\\'19-Mar-2001\\', `DD-Mon-YYYY\\'), `fmDdspth "of" Month YYYYHH:MI:SS AM\\') NEW_DATE FROM dual;

D. SELECTTO_CHAR(TO_DATE(\\'19-Mar-2001\\', `DD-Mon-YYYY), `fmDdspth "of" Month YYYYfmtHH:HI:SS AM\\') NEW_DATE FROM dual;

Correct Answer: A

QUESTION 4

Which two are true about aggregate functions? (Choose two.)

- B. You can use aggregate functions only in the column list of the select clause and in the WHERE clause of a SELECT statement.
- C. You can mix single row columns with aggregate functions in the column list of a SELECT statement by grouping on the single row columns.
- D. You can pass column names, expressions, constants, or functions as parameter to an aggregate function.
- E. You can use aggregate functions on a table, only by grouping the whole table as one single group.
- F. You cannot group the rows of a table by more than one column while using aggregate functions.

QUESTION 5

Examine these statements:

CREATE ROLE registrar;

GRANT UPDATE ON student_grades TO registrar;

GRANT registrar to user1, user2, user3;



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What does this set of SQL statements do?

- D. statement does not create 3 users with the role E. privilege is grant to role then grant to user
- F. privilege is grant to role then grant to user

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
